This year students achieved fantastic results, enabling them to go onto a variety of next steps, from au pairing in Australia, apprenticeships, joining the military, entering employment or starting university. Of the students moving onto university, 75% are off to Russell Group universities and 80% of students successfully achieved their first university choice.

The Honiton College team are proud of Hannah who is off to the University of Oxford, University College, to read History after achieving 3 A\*'s and 2 A's. Hannah said: "I am really pleased with my results, and grateful for all the support HCC have given me over the years."

Student Kayden is heading to Bournemouth University to study Physiotherapy after achieving ABB. This is a true testament to his hard work throughout his time at HCC, which was celebrated when he was awarded the Reading List Scholarship at the Post-16 Leavers Event.

Dominic will be starting his apprenticeship at the Pig Hotel group, and everyone at Honiton Community College is excited to see him continue to grow in the hospitality industry, whilst Sam is looking forward to starting his engineering career in the Army, following the success of his results today.

Part of the Ted Wragg Trust, students' school experience is about much more than just academic results and sixth formers enjoyed a range of enrichment activities and community initiatives during the year. The sixth formers engaged in a wide array of charitable initiatives during their time at HCC to raise awareness and money for charities such as Honiton Community Foodbank and the Samaritans, raising over £13,5000 across their two years at the sixth form.



Most recently, they stepped up for mental health in their final 24-hour charity challenge, which raised much-needed funds for the Exeter, Mid, and East Devon branch of the Samaritans. Staff and students walked continuously for 845 kilometres, raising over £2,600 for the charity's life-saving services. A fitting finale to the school's decade long series of Sixth Form 24-hour charity events, raising more than £26,000 for local causes during that time.



Before the summer, Year 13's enjoyed an awards event at the Waterfront Restaurant in Exeter to celebrate the end of their exams. Whilst enjoying plenty of pizza, staff and students had a wonderful time sharing their favourite moments from their time at HCC.

Sixth former Kayden was recognised for his commitment to his studies and Post 16 life at Honiton and was awarded the Reading List Scholarship of £275. The Students Student award and Cup was presented to Hannah who was congratulated by her peers for her kindness, curiosity and resilience. It was also a moment of reflection for staff on the journey of HCC and the difference the sixth form has made in the local Honiton community.

The sixth form students have been true ambassadors of the college and the community and this service, commitment to community and academic excellence has left a lasting legacy.
