We would also encourage you to look at Post-16 provision with your child. There are a number of taster days and open days approaching which may be of interest and can be very helpful in supporting future decision-making.

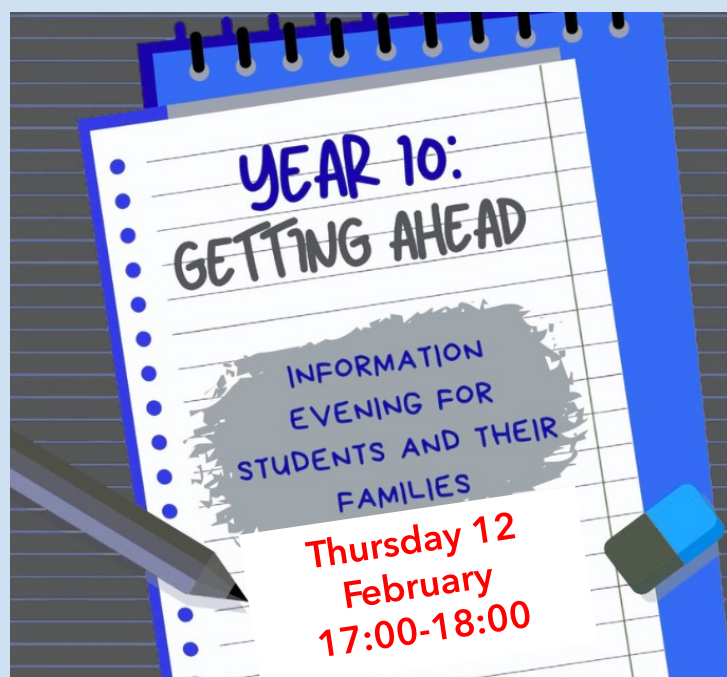
