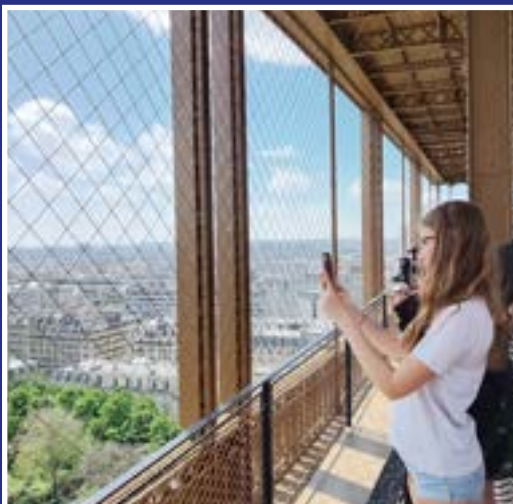


## A Magnifique Adventure: Paris 2025

We were really happy with the feedback from employers expressing how engaged our students were. This opportunity gave our students lots of food for thought and some even walked away with a free pen and tote bag!



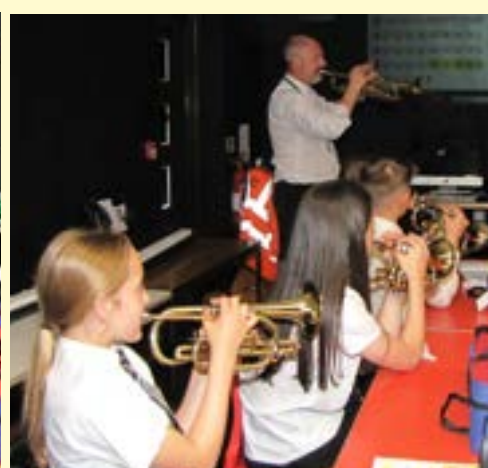

## Brass and Funk Project

As part of the Cycle 3 'Brass and Funk' project, all students in Year 7 have been given the opportunity to learn the Cornet. Even Mr Turner ( Head of Create) has learnt how to play prior to the project launch and together they have been mastering five notes from C to G on the Cornet and learning how to play a range of pieces on Charanga, an online music learning platform which the school uses.



All students have persevered and shown real resilience in learning how to play the five notes. Mr Turner has been really pleased with progress and how the students have been improving their reading of music notation at the same time!

This week, Brass taster sessions have started with Gail Denning, our peripatetic piano and brass teacher. These group sessions were offered to any Year 7's who wanted to learn even more about the Cornet.



Mr Turner successfully applied for funding from the Devon Music Hub to support these free taster sessions and is hoping now that a few Year 7's would like to continue and take up the Cornet.

## Visiting Artist in collaboration with the Honiton Town Council/ The Beehive and THG

We recently welcomed visiting Artist George Barron and Anna Aroussi from The Thelma Hulbert Gallery to HCC for a full day art workshop. The workshop was a great opportunity for Year 10 Fine Art GCSE students to experience a range of printing processes.

The students were challenged to create a personal response connected to the Honiton area, producing artwork that reflects its strong sense of community. It was also a great honor to welcome the Mayor and Mayoress during the workshop. As passionate advocates for the arts, they have played a key role in securing funding for this project.



### Project Title: Street Art & Printmaking: Typography and Place

This project explores the intersection of street art and printmaking, with a focus on typography and its relationship to place. Spanning the 20th and 21st centuries, it investigates how artists use typographic forms in public and communal contexts, from large-scale murals to grassroots printmaking initiatives.

By examining both historical and contemporary practices, the project highlights how creative expression shapes, and is shaped by, shared urban environments. Emphasis is placed on projects that celebrate accessibility, community engagement, and the power of words and design in public space.



The fabulous work produced by the students on the day will be featured in a display outside The Beehive, helping to make the public space more welcoming for residents.

We're excited for the final reveal later this year!

The winning House will be announced at Sports Day on Friday 20th June, via tutor teams and celebration assemblies.

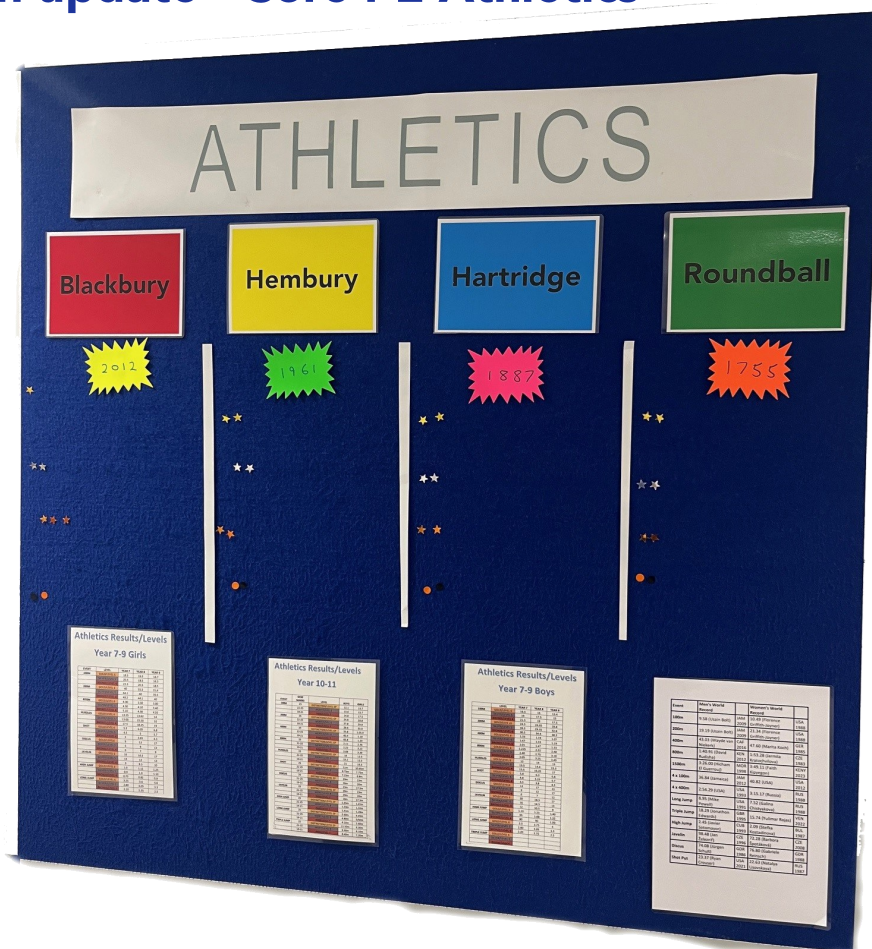

The UK Mathematics Trust run this national competition each year to test students' problem-solving abilities. It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency to make students think. The problems in the Junior Maths Challenge are designed to stretch beyond the curriculum and it is a real achievement to be awarded with bronze, silver or gold certificates for their fantastic performance.

Out of thousands of students across the country, only the top scores receive these awards. If you were given bronze that means you are the top 50%, silver for the top 25%, and gold is only the top 16.6%. For year 7s, there will be the chance to participate again next year. For year 8, there will be other challenges to take part in instead.

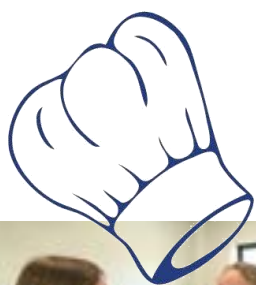

some superb rounders being scored and some excellent catches.

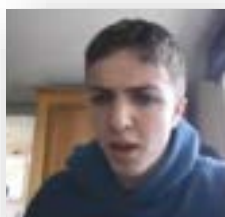
