

The Devon Front Door incorporates Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH). The Front Door receives all the requests for early help and safeguarding from people who are worried and concerned for children. These requests can come from professionals, such as the Police, Education and Health, but also members of the public, family members and young people

#### **Honiton Music Centre**



We are delighted to confirm that HCC will be starting the Honiton Music Centre as from September which will run every Wednesday between 4pm and 6:30pm at HCC's Music Department.

Mr Turner was successful in securing £4,000 from the Devon Music Education Hub, Department of Education and Arts Council England. Lewis Gibbs, Head of the Devon Music Education Hub popped by HCC to congratulate Mr Turner!

The focus of the Music Centre is to give all youngsters in Honiton (primary and secondary age) an opportunity to learn the violin, cello, flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, cornet and trombone at an affordable cost. For just £4 a week, young people will receive a 30-minute group session on their chosen instrument, a musicianship session lesson and an opportunity to play in an ensemble as they learn their instrument.

were truly impressive and did not go unnoticed. The afternoon was a fitting and meaningful close to their time at HCC, honouring a fantastic year group.




